Mark Seifried and Mark Longhurst

Beloved,

Mark Longhurst and I have been in conversation about his relationship with First Church. As you probably know, Mark and his family still live in Williamstown – up the street from me, in fact. Mark has been prayerfully supporting the congregation since his departure. He met with me in my first weeks of ministry and was very helpful in terms of me understanding certain relationships and practices that were elusive to me. We have conversed a few times since. I have high regard for Mark, personally and professionally. He tells me the same is true for him.

With this background, I wanted to let you know that I have been in conversation with the Deacons and Church Council about Mark and his family reengaging the church in some peripheral ways. His desire is that his family can be in community with other families seeking to ground their families in the love and justice of Jesus, which is at the heart of First Church's ministry. Both groups welcome the Longhurst family to be part of our flock. So, you can expect to see the family in children and family activities, perhaps joining us occasionally for worship and special programs.

With this new relationship, Mark will not be able to function in any pastoral capacity, for example to officiate at weddings, funerals or baptisms. Nor will he be able to be a pastoral confidant. That is my role and will be for pastors who follow me. Please bear in mind that Mark needs to be careful so as not to be perceived as interfering in the ministry of the church. For these reasons, he will limit the amount of socializing he does with the community outside of 906 Main Street.

This is new for Mark and the church. As the Longhurst family re-engages, Mark and I will check in with each other on occasion to see how things are working out. If you have questions or concerns, please contact me directly and we can talk about those issues.

In the meanwhile, we give thanks that "for everything there is a season," and that new life emerges, post-Longhurst pastorate, post-COVID, even post-Christian.

FCC member and Northern Berkshire Habitat for Humanity board member/volunteer Keith Davis has reached out to us for assistance in recruiting some new board members for this organization.

Affordable housing is a significant issue for Williamstown, and Northern Berkshire Habitat for Humanity has made a commitment to build several houses here over the next few years. Please talk with others who might be interested and share this request:

The Northern Berkshire Habitat for Humanity is seeking board members. Some of our board members have moved away and as things start to open up as COVID hopefully will have a smaller impact we will be able to utilize a broader group of volunteers. The board meets once per month currently via Zoom but eventually in person. Some of the tasks we need assistance on include:

- 1. An assistant for Kathy Kaulker in writing Grants
- 2. A volunteer coordinator
- 3. Members on our community relations committee
- 4. Someone to update our website and Facebook page.
- 5. Fundraising committee members.

We are trying to expand our board so the amount of time members spend is minimal. Currently, Beth Goodman is president, Cynthia Payne and me are board members. I also assist on the build site.

We expect to finish the current project by the first of July and the new home owner can move in. The family consists of a single mother, a 10 year old daughter and an 8 year old son. Currently, the sheetrock installation, taping, and mudding are complete and we are painting the walls and ceilings.

We will gather again weekly on Fridays at 5 pm in the center of Field Park in Williamstown (the green on the rotary). A speaker will give a short reading to honor, mourn and uplift recent victims in support of their families and communities. At 5:15, we will join in respectful silence for 9 minutes and 29 seconds around the Park's perimeter, in honor of George Floyd and the countless other Black people killed by police brutality and other forms of white supremacist violence.
